- AGLS Faculty is awaiting feedback from SLT regarding 2026 budget and ability to include security for H&S of lab access
- Counselling services from health centre are now offering online counselling appointments for online students which is currently a work in progress. LUSA is awaiting for full process to be sent through.
- Increasing representation for diverse languages is ongoing as time allocation has been limited within the executive. This will be integrated into 2026 handovers.
- Signage has a strong focus on the accessibility. The LUSA executive involved have met and also spoken with LU Student Experience manager regarding usage of previous signage and how event signage could also be incorporated to become longer term.
- Ticket sales of Garden party have increased and forecasted to slightly improve. Ongoing lack of ability o for additional external funding/ sponsorship for the event.
- Delivery of the nationwide bus card service, Motu Move, has been delayed, meaning little meaningful advocacy can be done about tertiary bus services until final decisions have been made nationwide.
- Various spaces across campus are potentially to be utilized until more permanent spaces can be found for Postgrads. A push will also be needed to promote a drive of spaces for all students.
- As election has recently finished for 2026 LUSA exec. Preliminary dates for next year election and statistics from the recent election are ongoing.

i. GM's Report

- Some glitched occurred in election voting within the first hour; however, these were remedied quickly. We will look at how to mitigate this risk for coming years.
- Election voter turnout totalled just over 22% of eligible student population, which was higher than 12.5% in 2024 and 2.9% in 2023.
- RAM magazines in stands have been moving quickly and are hard to find in the week after release.

- The new line on budget variance forms sundry then coming onto chargeable expenses
- Study break costs for Sem1 was \$7,000 and the same will be budgeted for in Sem2.
- Encouraged for Exec to look at spending their portfolio allocation as spending of it has been low this year. Part of training next year will look at how this money could be spent within the portfolios for students and will be incorporated into fortnightly meetings.

iv. 2026 Budget

- Overall 2026 budget has a negative bottom line of \$55,648
- This a deficit exec are aiming to reduce to ensure sustained financial stability of LUSA.
- To look into events as Garden Party which currently has high costs and ensuring this is meeting the needs of the students, such as having a second stage. This could create flexibility in the budget.
- Increases in the various event costs, where 2025 has not seen full amount being spent, ensuring budget reflects the spending.
- Advised to investigate which areas costs could be reduced with feasibility to have low consequences. Money is currently spent very tightly meaning limited ability for flexibility however a deficit is unable to be sustained for a long period.

The 2026 Budget will be brought back to Board Meeting 10. The Gm is open to comments from the executive on ideas and options to reduce the deficit of the budget
